Fourth Grade

This week, I visited all of the fourth grade classrooms to



present a Career Awareness lesson. Prior to the start of the lesson, each student completed a brief career interest inventory survey that explored various student interests and used their strengths to identify career clusters of interest. The career clusters included: Human Services, Health Sciences, Communication Services, Business Services, Technical Sciences,

and Agricultural Sciences. After the students completed the survey and identified clusters of interest, we explored each career cluster by learning about the subcategories of the cluster and discussing various student interests and strengths that are aligned with each career cluster, as well as specific careers within the cluster.

This lesson helped the students to identify potential careers of interest, as well as to learn about careers that were new to them. We discussed how our interests and strengths can help to point us in the direction of various careers for further exploration, which will be of benefit to the students when they begin to think more about possible careers and courses of study for school in the future. We also discussed how our interests and skills can change over time, but that it is beneficial to start thinking about our interests and strengths now and how we can explore our interests to better aid in future career planning.



Requirements & Compensation

Substitute Teachers

Valid Ohio Teaching or Substitute License (we can guide you through the process) required \$115 per day.

Substitute Food Service Workers

Basic food preparation/kitchen safety to serve students. Must be available between 6:30am-2:00pm - \$11 per hour.

Substitute Custodians

We will provide training for positions as needed - \$14 per hour.

Substitute Bus Drivers

Drivers are required to have a CDL Class B, with school bus and passenger endorsements. We can set you up with the required training - \$20.17 per hour.

Substitute Aides

Special Education aides are needed to work with our special needs students \$15 per hour. Cafe/Playground aides monitor students during the lunch hour and on the playground \$11 per hour.

Substitute Secretaries

Secretaries needed to fill positions within the district - \$13 per hour.
