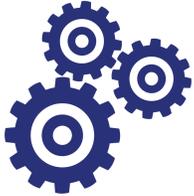
LEARNER'S MINDSET

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CRITICAL THINKING

A GENERAL deliberately and consistently investigates to expand and improve the quality of one's own thinking by embracing the process of analyzing, assessing and reconstructing information to propose solutions that are mindful of the impact they may have on other parts of the system.
